In terms of East Lothian provision, we contribute to the core costs of a 10-bed unit Penumbra Milestone based in Oxgang Road, Edinburgh along with the other 4 IJBs in Lothian. This resource is registered as a specialist resource for people with ARBD by the Care Inspectorate.

accept people suspected of having ARBD, as well as those with a diagnosis. A process of assessments (neuropsychological, occupational therapy, psychiatric) can take place in this setting; the ARBD multidisciplinary team work closely with Penumbra staff, inreaching to provide these assessments and agree rehabilitation plans. Registered with the Care Inspectorate as a specialist ARBD resource.

2. Loretto Fullarton 1196 Tollcross Road Glasgow

The specialist ARBD service provides 22 placements across studio flats within a purpose-built development. Loretto is a rehabilitation service for people with a diagnosis of ARBD who require

psycho-social treatment for people with a diagnosis of ARBD.

Glasgow HSCP ARBD Team have developed a Recovery Passport to support people with a diagnosis of ARBD throughout their care journey. The assessment and care planning tool was developed in response to service user issues highlighted at engagement events and forums in relation to a lack of knowledge of ARBD and the impact on daily living from professionals and others providing support. The Recovery Passport ensures that service users influence and direct their own recovery plans, decide what information is important to share with others, and prevents the need to re-tell their journey to
